A life of blindness means these people are unable to work, complete simple tasks or see the faces of loved ones.

Imagine not being able to see your family or the colours, sights and beauty of the world around you.

This is what more than 300 million people in the world face – every day – because they have poor vision due to eye disease or a lack of suitable glasses.

Blind children in the developing world receive little – if any – education and their employment opportunities are limited. Blind adults are unlikely to be able to hold down a job or provide for their families. They become trapped in a life of poverty.

More than three-quarters of this blindness is avoidable but the scarcity of health resources and lack of awareness in poorer communities means that this immense problem continues to grow. An undersupply of eye care professionals is the biggest challenge faced by many developing countries.

Our shared vision is to lift the veil of blindness and help developing nations restore sight to their blind.

Despite our own issues, Australia is undoubtedly a 'lucky country' when it comes to health care. In an increasingly connected and interdependent world, it is only reasonable that we should share our resources, skills and knowledge to improve the lives of others.

This is Sight For All's mission.

Sight For All is different to many groups working in this area. We do not raise money just to fly teams of doctors into neighbouring countries to perform operations.

There's a great saying that goes 'give a man a fish and feed him for a meal, teach him how to fish and feed him for a lifetime'.
